Kimley-Horn Associates Selected to Evaluate Options for Pedestrian Crossing over Dallas North Tollway at Belt Line

Addison's <u>City-Wide Trails Master Plan</u>, adopted by Council on May 25, 2021, identifies the Dallas North Tollway (DNT) as presenting the greatest obstacle to providing safe and convenient active transportation access between west and east Addison. Addison west of the DNT is experiencing tremendous growth with Addison Airport, the DART Silver Line and Cotton Belt Trail, the Quorum Art Walk, and the Addison Circle Park transit-oriented development. Likewise, Addison east of the DNT is seeing substantial redevelopment in Village on the Parkway and Prestonwood Place.

At its January 9 meeting, the City Council approved an agreement with Kimley-Horn Associates to perform a feasibility study to review options for providing a pedestrian and bicycle crossing along Belt Line Road over DNT. The main purpose of the project is to provide safety and comfort for pedestrians crossing the DNT while reducing barriers and providing access to major destinations in west and east Addison. A secondary goal of the project is to create a landmark that identifies Addison and is visible from the main lanes of the DNT. The North Central Texas Council of Governments and the Texas Department of Transportation fully support and provide funding opportunities for active transportation projects using similar criteria stated above. This study would provide information necessary for a grant application.

Council Receives Public Works and Engineering Update


Public Works and Engineering Director Shannon Hicks provided Council with an update on the department's key operations, capital improvement projects, and bond projects for Fiscal Year 2024 at the January 9 City Council meeting. Some of the highlights of the presentation included:

- Addison has been awarded a Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) grant for nearly \$600,000 for signal improvements at the Belt Line Road and Business Avenue intersection.
- Construction is set to begin on the Keller Springs reconstruction project in early 2024.
- Progress is being made with irrigation, trail, retaining walls, and traffic signals on the south side of the Midway Road project and the northbound lanes from Belt Line Road to Keller Springs are under construction. The anticipated substantial completion of the entire project is still on schedule for Spring 2024.
- The Rawhide Creek ADA and Drainage Improvement project was completed in December 2023.
- Design is underway for the Quorum Drive and Montfort Road reconstruction projects.



The PIT count is a nationwide event that brings together volunteers, community leaders, and street outreach workers to conduct a census of persons experiencing homelessness. Metrocrest Services will conduct the 2024 PIT count in Addison, Carrollton, Coppell, and Farmers Branch. Volunteers will work in teams alongside a street outreach expert to walk designated areas collecting census data. The information collected will help us understand the extent of homelessness in the Metrocrest area and provide data on Metrocrest Services' efforts to make homelessness rare, brief, and non-recurring. In 1998, Salim Asrawi's vision seemed audacious — launching a Brazilian steakhouse empire from a small kitchen in Addison, TX. Fast forward to today, the 56-year-old president of <u>Texas de Brazil Corp</u>. now oversees a \$460 million family-owned chain with 66 restaurants globally, reaching as far as Saudi Arabia and South Korea. Asrawi's journey began with skepticism from banks regarding his Belt Line Road location choice, but he knew he found something special in Addison.

Undeterred, he, alongside his mother and uncle, invested \$500,000 to open the first Texas de Brazil. In 2024, that original location is celebrating its 25th anniversary. An Addison gem by any measure, Texas de Brazil is a place to celebrate birthdays, anniversaries, holiday parties, promotions, and much more because every visit is a festive and unforgettable culinary experience.
